

HEIGHTS
Contour elevations in feet refer to mean sea level. Vertical datums refer to mean high water elevation which is 1.930 feet above mean sea level.

AUTHORITIES

HORIZONTAL DATUM

Geographic positions referred to the North American Datum of 1983 must be corrected an average of 0.30' eastward and 3.00' westward to agree with this chart.

LAKE LEVEL
This lake is subject to drawdowns which vary considerably from year to year. The maximum conventional drawdown during seasons of extremely low natural flow conditions is 8 feet below normal lake level.


