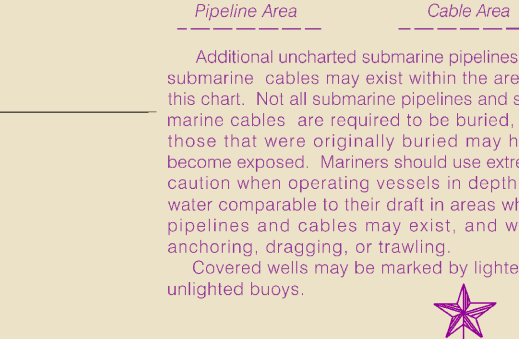
RADAR REFLECTORS: Radar reflectors have been placed on many floating aids to navigation.

HORIZONTAL DATUM: The horizontal reference datum of this chart is North American Datum of 1983 (NAD 83).

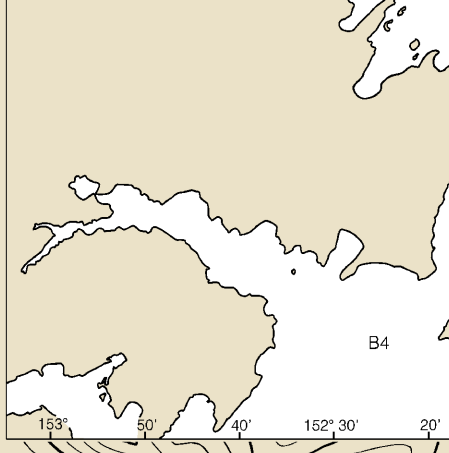
CAUTION: Submarine pipelines and cables: Channel submarine pipeline and submarine cables and submarine pipeline and cable areas are shown as follows:
